District 2 Update

Dear Neighbor,

As we move into the holiday season, we look forward to spending time with our family and friends. During this special time of the year we have many things to be thankful for and I'd like to especially thank our first responders for their dedication and hard work in keeping all of us safe.

I would also like to acknowledge and thank the many non-profits and volunteers in our communities that help provide the essential services to our most vulnerable residents. These non-profits range from helping the homeless, foster youths, struggling families and at-risk youths to get through the holiday season. This holiday season I'd like to encourage you to get invilved and reach out to a nonprofit and see how you can make a difference in your community and the lives of the less fortunate. I'd also like to discuss some of the things we accomplished last month and what we have to moving forward:

Housing Near the Job Centers

As a Committee Member for the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG), we are tasked with planning growth over the next decade for the Southern California Region. Last month, in a dramatic shift in how we plan for housing, the SCAG Committee with the help of Riverside, San Bernardino and Los Angeles counties and cities decided to push for more housing in coastal rather than inland cities.

The original SCAG plan would have pushed more growth to the Inland Empire and desert cities and would have required Riverside County to bear the burden of all the new housing that would have been mandated. With the help of City of Riverside Mayor Rusty Bailey and City of Los Angeles Mayor Eric Garcetti, the common theme shared during the meeting was that in order for our residents to have a better quality of life, we could not continue to outsource our workers from outside the region and to actually provide them an opportunity to live where they work.

The original plan would have required desert regions like the City of Coachella to build approximately 15,000 new homes over the next decade versus the City of Laguna Beach (near job rich Irvine) to only build 55 homes.

The overall plan the committee ultimately approved will require Los Angeles and Orange counties to plan for approximately 124,000 additional houses compared to the alternative plan, which largely would have shifted those homes to Riverside and San Bernardino counties and cities.

Adoption Celebrations

In honor of November as National Adoption Month, the Riverside County Department of Public Social Services (DPSS) held their annual adoption finalization ceremony on November 2nd at the Historic Downtown Riverside Courthouse. Forty families gathered to celebrate the final step in adopting 56 amazing children.

More than 100 Foster Care children await permanent adoptive homes in Riverside County on any given day. "There are many wonderful children in need of loving and supportive families," said Sarah Mack, Director of the Riverside County Department of Public Social Services.

Point-in-Time (PIT) Count - Volunteers Needed

Over the past year, homelessness has become one of our community's most pressing and hotly contested problems. As I and my fellow Supervisors focus our efforts to tackle it head-on, I am asking for your help and involvement.

Every January, Riverside County conducts an annual "Point-in-Time Homeless Count" as a way to gauge how many homeless live on our streets and in shelters, as well as to gather key demographic information. The Department of Housing and Urban Development requires all communities that receive federal funding, including Riverside County, to perform the count to help determine the level of funding jurisdictions receive each year. Having an accurate count is vitally important to ensure that Riverside County receives the funding we need to provide essential homeless supportive and preventative services.

The 2020 Point-in-Time Count will take place over the course of three days with the highest concentration taking place during the street-based survey on Wednesday, January 29. The following two days will see volunteers specifically surveying for homeless persons who are under the age of 25. In order to have as accurate of a count as possible, we are seeking at least 700 volunteers to assist with the three-day count. Roughly that same number participated in the 2019 survey, which documented 2,811 sheltered and unsheltered homeless adults and minors throughout the county, a 21% increase from the 2018 count results.

Training is required for all volunteers prior to the count and volunteers must have a smart phone or tablet to conduct the survey, be able to walk up to two hours, and be 18 years or older. Volunteers ages 16-17 must be accompanied by an adult. The Point-in-Time Count is scheduled for **Wednesday, January 29, 220 from 5:30AM to 9:30AM.** The Youth Count is scheduled for January 29-31 from 2:00PM to 8:00PM.




