

Voices for Children seeks Community Volunteers to Advocate for Children in Foster Care

If you are looking for a unique way to give back to our community and you have a heart for children and teens, consider Voices for Children. Voices for Children is the Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) program for Riverside County. CASAs are volunteers who advocate for a child or sibling group in foster care. Children in foster care have been removed from their homes due to abuse or neglect. A CASA spends time with the child, works to understand their needs, communicates with professionals on the case including social workers and attorneys, and advocates for the child's best interests to the judge who is making decisions about the child and their family.

Voices for Children guides CASA volunteers every step of the way and provides all of the training that volunteers need to begin. All CASA volunteers are supported by Voices for Children's professional team of Advocacy Supervisors. Volunteers are asked to make an 18-month commitment and visit their child at least once per month. Most volunteers report that they dedicate between 10-15 hours per month to their advocacy.

Voices for Children is a nonprofit organization that has been serving Riverside County since 2015. Since that time, it has grown to serve more than 400 of the county's children. Twenty-four District 2 residents served as CASAs last year. However, thousands of children spend time in the county's child welfare system each year. As the only organization designated by the court to operate the CASA program in Riverside County, VFC is seeking to grow its CASA program to reach more children who need an advocate.
