- Discussed the illegal parking on freeway ramps, they do enforce as needed
- They are aware of the parking issues on Temescal Canyon Rd
- -They are working in conjunction with other impacted agencies on Poppy related traffic issues and safety concerns.

- Parking issues caused by the Poppies have been minor, the biggest safety concern has been slow traffic.
- Officers have been working the school issues and will continue to do so.
- We are continuing to monitor the Weirick/Dos Lagos freeway traffic issues
- Issued was raised from the floor that the on-ramp signal lights are not always working, Lt. Amarillas indicated that this was an Cal Trans issue.
- Terramor resident raised concern about trucks not stopping at stops signs, answer was that if observed, driver would be cited.
- Lt Amarillas thanked everyone for the questions and informed audience that they should feel free to visit our office in Riverside

- Eric Cadden EMD Program Supervisor
  - Stressed the fact that EMD is working with the CHP to manage the current poppy bloom
  - There are 2 Officers on the weekend to manage the situation
  - Snow in the Idyllwild area has caused some damage and EMD was assisting
  - Stress the needed caution due to possible road flooding during heavy rains. (Turnaround-Don't Drown)
  - Evacuation routes and Shelters will be determined per emergency
  - Evacuation order may be as simple as "Shelter in Place." It is important to be prepared.

  - County Emergency Operation Center will be activation as needed.

  - She is a part of the Community Outreach Team
  - EMD is working on the Temescal Valley local mitigation plan and is seeking input on prioritizing local hazard concerns.

#### 4.1 T&B Planning Inc. Proposed Commercial Development

- Brian Wong, Senior VP of North Palisades Partners presented
- Proposed project is a 200,000 square foot warehouse located at 22740 Temescal Valley Road.
- Mr. Wong reviewed the site plan and architectural and landscape renderings.
- It will be a Class A industrial facility, concrete tilt-up with truck level access doors.
- The Project is at the south end of the Wildrose Business Park.

- Project Manager for the Deleo Regional Sports Park project

- The planned enhancements would include: 1) additional exercise stations; 2) resurfacing the playground area before summer; 3) two pickleball courts; 4) a sand volleyball court
