III. Approval of Minutes

- A. February 8, 2015 TVMAC meeting minutes approved. (Bob Hafner motions, Jerry Sincich seconded). March was the town hall meeting.

IV. Reports

- A. Roberta Tandy – Update on community member reaching out and helping
1. Family in Horse thief in which the mother passed away after giving birth to twins.
 2. Delivered 50 boxes of diapers and wipes
 3. Delivered \$1100 in food gift cards.
 4. Trilogy helped out where they can
 5. Offered to pick up or drop off any item they would like to do for donations.
- B. Update from Sheriff's Department – Capt Holandworth
1. 450 calls to service
 2. Most calls are around theft. Getting crimes of opportunity
 3. Make sure garage and cars locked up and bring in garage door openers
 4. 43 arrest two burglaries, 11 felony arrests.
 5. A couple gentlemen tried to break into house. Neighbors round up and caught criminals.
 6. We are having 4 deputies in program. They are doing well we should be getting them into the fold.
 7. Keep an eye out on new monument and vandalism.
 8. Discussed one of the incidents at random.
 9. Discussed about staffing up with new apartments going in with higher population.
 10. Talked about communication between police and FedEx and UPS.
 11. Talked about the benefits of neighborhood watch.
- C. Code Enforcement – Officer Mullins
1. Went over what he covers. Vehicle codes, housing codes, Illegal dumping, violations on properties
 2. Re enacting Work release program to do some of the pickup road side trash. Working on doing twice a week.
 3. Working on contract storage areas to get cleaned up
 4. Right now two officers to cover area
 5. Contact through the website.
 6. Take a look at properties setting up illegal mobile home park.
- D. CAL/Fire Update –
1. Got our new battalion Chief Scott Lane
 2. Back up to full funding for both battalion chiefs
 3. 113 incidents this month Average response time around 5 minutes. Hit 52% calls in this time (72 medical calls, and 23 traffic collisions)
 4. We had only 9% of our calls over 10 minutes which is excellent for the size of the area that they need to cover.

5. Thanks for the efforts to help the families out in Horse Thief Canyon.
 6. Responded to fatality on I-15 and she was one of the individuals in the fire service.
 7. Talked about one of the earliest fire seasons.
 8. Ramped up for fire season
 9. Fire season is 72 days longer than before.
 10. Talked about weed abate issues.
 11. Handing out information on Ready, Set, Go!! How to prep during fire season.
 12. Fireworks have to be reported to code enforcement.
- E. Update on Temescal Valley Faire – Miriam Cardenas
1. May 16 is the Temescal Valley Faire at the Deleo Regional Sports park from 11 – 4
 1. Talked about a pet show and photo contest. You can bring any pet you want. Provided it won't hurt anyone. Also have pet parade, best costume, and best look alike. Pictures need to be taken in Temescal Valley. Pictures are on people, things to do, and animals.
 2. Talked about registering a business or booth to present at the faire Instead of \$125 it is now \$30. This was to help out home businesses
 3. Talked about everything is 50 cents (hot dogs, sodas, snow cones, cotton candy). Free watermelon
 4. Supervisors Jeffries and CAL/Fire and Sheriff department will be there
 5. She is asking for volunteers.
- F. Update Temescal Valley Signage – Bob Hafner
1. Showed slide show of the presently installed signs.
 2. Discussed the signs produced, the ones installed and the ones to be installed.
 3. Talked about availability of business and residential signs to be purchased.
- G. Update from Melissa Melendez – Denni Horne
1. All bills have been submitted for this year
 2. AB8150 – this bill brings back possession of a fire arm back to a felony. This will also work with another bill to make possession of a date rape drug back to a felony. This means they will get jail time. It follows you
 3. AB8225 – If you give false accusation of threatening with a gun. If found guilty this will be a felony
 4. Increase in minimum wage and increase in taxes on services
 5. Monitoring what the governor's declaration on water conservation is. Governor acting in his right of state constitution
 6. In district to have community coffee on April 21 evening in Murrieta at the Backyard and tap room 7:00 pm.
 7. Discussed ways to save water in showers and barrels and buckets to reuse water.

- D. Update South coast Air Quality Management – Tracy Gauss and Daniel Soto
1. Discussed what their response of air quality of all of Riverside, LA, and Orange County
 2. Monitor with 35 permanent air station
 3. Monitor the businesses for maintaining the air quality. They cannot monitor mobile sources (autos and trucks). This is about 8%. 4% come from stuff you use.
 4. Correct pollution with better technology.
 5. Look at having Plug in at ports instead of running off diesel.
 6. Talked about most pollution getting blown inland.
 7. Talked about how program is role model for the rest of the world.
 8. Some of the worst fine particulate matter in the state. Have guidelines when they can do burns
 9. Southern California Association of Governments is one who looks at money for improving transportation.

- G. Supervisors Office – Kristen Huyck
1. Dawson Canyon is in TVMAC and not in Woodcrest MAC
 2. There will be rotation of chair and vice chair for our MAC. This is not based on performance. It is based on policy.
