III. Approval of Minutes

- A. May 13, 2015 TVMAC meeting minutes approved. (Jerry Sincich motions; Craig Deleo seconds)

IV. Reports

- A. Update from Sheriff Department – Lt. Pemberton
1. Total calls for service in May: 403
 1. Assaults: 2
 2. Burglary: 3
 3. Thefts: 9
- B. Update from Cal Fire Department – Jim Brown
1. 125 calls last month; 76% medical responses & 11.2% traffic collision responses
 2. Response time average 5.6 minutes
 3. Burn permits suspended for outdoor residential burning within the State Responsibility Area of Riverside County. The suspension takes effect June 1, 2015
 4. Fireworks are prohibited in Riverside County
 5. Scott Lane Battalion 4 Chief will be located in Norco
- C. Update from Assemblywoman Melissa Melendez's Office – Deni Horne
1. AB 150 gun theft legislation that would restore penalties for firearm theft to felony grand theft was killed in the Assembly Appropriations Committee
 2. AB 218 will allow for negotiations to begin regarding the relinquishment of a 6 mile portion of state Route 74 (between Lake Elsinore and Perris) from the Department of Transportation to the County of Riverside
 3. AB 278 would require any general law city with a population of 100,000 or more to move to district-based elections, in which residents in specific areas would elect a single council member to represent their areas, rather than having a voice in every council member up for election. This bill is continuing to move through the state Assembly.
 4. Discussion of AB 277 which would eliminate the exemption from existing specified immunization requirements based upon personal beliefs, but would allow exemption from future immunization requirements deemed appropriate by the State Department of Public Health. The bill would exempt pupils in a home-based private school.

1. No update

V. New Business

- A. Update on the current California Water Cutbacks and How it Affects Us – Matt Conway, Elsinore Valley Municipal Water District
1. Elsinore Valley Municipal Water District (EVMWD) water supply comes from: 1) MWD (70%); 2) local wells (20%); 3) Canyon Lake (10%)

2. Effective July 1st a 15% reduction in imported water from Colorado River and State Water Project California Aqueduct
 3. Governor's New Water Conservation Executive Order of 2015 calling for a 25% mandatory reduction in water use compared to 2013 water use
 4. New development will continue with an expected 2 to 3 percent growth. New development will not have turf.
 5. EVMWD to meet the state imposed reduction goal is mandating Stage 4a water guidelines for all customers which includes
 1. No watering during or within 48 hours after a rain event
 2. New landscapes can only be irrigated on drip irrigation
 3. Cover swimming pools to reduce evaporation
 4. Only water 2 times per week based on last number of address
 5. Washing of vehicles is permitted only at car washes that recycle the water
 6. Hotels/Motels to give the option to have linens and towels reused
 7. No watering of landscape between 6 AM and 6PM
 6. Residential rebate programs include
 1. Turf removal
 2. Free sprinkler nozzles
 3. Landscape classes
 4. Drip conversion program
 5. Pressure regulating valve
 6. Free mulch
 7. Pool cover rebate
 8. Residential water use evaluation

- B. Corona-Norco Unified School District Update on Education – Ted Rozzi, Assistant Superintendent of Facilities
1. New funding system provides the Corona-Norco Unified School District an additional 44% due to demographics
 2. Corona-Norco Unified School District utilizing common core standards
 3. The new students emanating from new residential developments can be accommodated by: 1) expansion of existing schools; 2) redistribution of students within existing schools; 3) a new small intermediate school; 4) conversion of Temescal Valley elementary schools to K-8 schools
 4. Santiago High School is not at capacity and can accommodate students from new residential development
 5. Currently there are no plans to build a new comprehensive high school
 6. The Corona-Norco Unified School District still owns 56 acres in the Temescal Valley
 7. Estimate cost of building a new school in the Corona-Norco Unified School District
 1. Elementary - \$30 - \$40 Million
 2. Intermediate - \$50 Million +
 3. High school - \$120 Million
 4. Small High school - \$40 - \$50 Million
 8. Temescal Valley is within Trustee Area 5 and represented by Trustee 5
 9. Measure GG by issuing \$396 million in bonds will provide local funding to improve Corona, Norco and Eastvale schools
 10. Regional Occupational Programs (ROP) are offered that provide a variety of career technical education courses
